Mrs. Thomas J. Tobin.

Mrs. Thomas J. Tobin, wife of Thomas J. Tobin, night superintendent of the Western Union Telegraph Company, died at her home, 62 Van Buren street, on Sunday evening. Mrs. Tobin had been a resident of the Twenty-third Ward for many years and during that time was a parishioner of St. Ambrose's Church, at DeKalb and Tompkins avenues. She was a devoted, energetic and popular member of many of the charitable associations attached to that church, and among her wide circle of friends and in the discharge of her charitable duties she was remarkable for her kind, sympathetic and generous nature and for her bright and cheerful disposition. Mrs. Tobin was the granddaughter of the late Charles Toal, an old and well known resident of the Seventh Ward, New York, and of the late John C. Fitzpatrick of Washington, D. C., for more than forty years financial clerk of the United States Senate.

Henry Prager.

Henry Prager, for thirty years a resident of Brooklyn, died last night at his home, 178 Nassau street, in his 100th year. Mr. Prager was a first cousin of Louis Prager, who died in Manhattan last year at the age of 101. Two sons and three daughters survive him, and his oldest son, Isaac, with whom he was living, is now 68 years old. One sister also survives, who is now the last of a large family. She was the youngest and all the children between her and her brother, who was the oldest, have been dead for some time.
