

PITTSBURGER HERE TO WED.

Merchant Kaufmann's Son Comes to This State So He Can Marry Cousin.

Edgar Jonas Kaufmann, son of Isaac Kaufmann, a dry goods dealer of Pittsburg, and his first cousin, Lillian Sarah Kaufmann, daughter of Morris Kaufmann, also of Pittsburg, will be married this evening at the Hotel St. Regis. Mr. and Miss Kaufmann came to New York from Pittsburg on Sunday afternoon on a special train for the purpose of getting married in New York, because the laws of Pennsylvania prohibit the marriage of first cousins. In the party on the special were Mr. Kaufmann's father and the Rev. Dr. Leonard Levy of Pittsburg, who will assist Dr. Stephen S. Wise in performing the marriage ceremony.

The bridegroom-to-be went to the City Hall yesterday and obtained a marriage certificate. He gave his age as 23.

"Yes, we are first cousins, and we came to New York to get married because of that fact," Miss Kaufmann said to a *TIMES* reporter yesterday. "I have known my cousin all my life, but we have been engaged only a short time. There is no romance connected with our marriage, except that we came here in a special train, if you consider that one. For our honeymoon trip we are going to motor through the Berkshires and the White Mountains."
