

Dr. Seymour Oppenheimer Dies; Ear-Nose-Throat Specialist, 85

**Author of Textbook Had Also
Been Plastic Surgeon and
Consultant at Hospitals**

Dr. Seymour Oppenheimer, retired specialist in ear, nose and throat diseases and in plastic surgery, died Sunday in St. Luke's Hospital after a long illness. He was 85 years old and lived at 230 Central Park West.

Dr. Oppenheimer was born here and graduated from New York University Medical College in 1892. He then studied in London and Vienna and practiced medicine here from 1895 to 1924, achieving prominence as an ear-nose-throat specialist. Later he studied plastic surgery in London and on the Continent and lived for a time in Paris.

After that, he was a plastic surgeon and a consultant on ear-nose-throat matters here till his retirement twenty years ago.

From 1903 to 1920, Dr. Oppenheimer was a member of the staff of Mount Sinai Hospital, where he was formerly chief of the ear, nose and throat clinic. He was a consulting otolaryngologist at Willard Parker Hospital and had been a consulting plastic surgeon at the Hospital for Joint Diseases, Bellevue Hospital and Monmouth Memorial Hospital, Long Branch, N. J. He was a diplomate of the American Board of Otolaryngology.

He was the author of a text-

book, "Surgery of the Middle Ear." Dr. Oppenheimer had been a member of the New York Academy of Medicine, the American Academy of Ophthalmology and Otolaryngology, the American Medical Association and the New York State and County Medical Societies.

Surviving are his widow, Elsa; a daughter, Mrs. Clarence Low of New York; a grandson and two great-grandchildren.
